COMMÜNITY ENGAGEMENT

with Pastor John O'Connor

Welcome to 2019. I pray that the first couple of weeks have been filled with Joy and our Father's Love. What a wonderful year it is! What a wonderful day it is, that you can be reading this right now. Galatians 4:4-7 says:

"...God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. 6 And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" 7 So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God."

(and more in some cases)? The difference is

that they do it without the hope of an all-powerful, all-knowing, all-present Father!

The downside of a good work ethic. All my life I have tried to be what others may call a hard worker. To lie abed was unheard of. To arrive late or to leave early was the same. Tired was only allowed when the day was done and only then could you take a break.

A person with a good work ethic was someone who could be depended upon to get the job done. It was someone who required very little assistance, able to accomplish without calling for help.

So when my neighbor had a professional cut down a tree I gladly drug out my trusted chain saws and tackled the task of working them into firewood. However, the tree was a full 36 inches in diameter for the first 24 feet. My saw blades were only 18 inches.

Did I hire help? Did I ask for help? No, I just put the saw in place and began cutting! First one side and then the other. If the block of wood did not come off I just went to the next length. Eventually, the saw would cut through completely and then it required rolling over so that I could cut from the other side.

I knew that if I had help, the task would have been easier for me. But to ask would seem like weakness.

God has called me to an impossible task. He asks me to lay aside my pride and acknowledge that I need Him. I cannot fulfill my responsibilities as a pastor nor even as a follower of Jesus without His constant abiding presence and power.

I need His love in order to love others. I need His wisdom to make wise choices. I need His enlightening to understand His Word. I need His enabling to accomplish His calling upon my life. I must recognize that without Him I am nothing.
