Here in the SOAR Prayer Room, we have several stations for you to pray for specific things. Here are some ideas about how you can pray at each of these Prayer Stations.

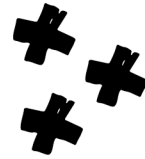
➤ Soar Staff and Worship Team

Then ask Him for your needs with confidence.



And finally, yield to God as He leads you through His Word and Spirit.

One great way to pray is to use God's Word as your guide! Take a moment to read **Colossians 1:9-14**. What things did Paul (the author) tell these people that he was praying for on their behalf?

- Know God's will *v.9*
- Live a life that pleases God *v.10a*
- Live so others can see evidence of your faith in Christ *v.10b*
- Know more about God *v.10c*
- Be more patience and endure *v.11*
- And be thankful and joyful in every circumstance *v.12*
